1) Quorum Call

2) Approval of Agenda

2) Approval of May 21st minutes

The minutes of the 21 May 2010 Faculty Senate meeting were adopted.

3) AMICAL conference by Bella Avagyan and Berj Gatrjyan

Aram asked Bella and Berj to present their feedback from the recently attended AMICAL conference. This was the latest of the 6 annual conferences bringing together consortium members from American Universities regarding academic libraries. Last year nearly 60 participants came to Armenia, while this year's conference was held in Budapest. Tom Samuelian together with the two presenters today were present in Hungary. The theme was advancing learning, teaching, and research through collaborative library resources. While last year's theme focused on students, this year, the focus was on institutional repositories, digital collections, and cloud computing. Experts presented, shared knowledge and introduced new technologies. Participants included librarians, faculty members, and IT staff from various American University members of the consortium. Topics most frequently discussed were about databases, e-printing, institutional repositories, portfolios, e-resources, etc. It was stressed that participants should share the information from the conference with their campus stakeholders. AUA participants have a strong tradition of sharing knowledge and experiences with library personnel in

Armenia outside of AUA as well. There was also a presentation of the IT-services that are intertwined with the library resources in universities today. Various platforms, open source resources, domains for collections, request tracking systems, and other e-resources were presented. The AUA participants answered several questions from the FS members and promoted a lively discussion of the conference events. Over time, the participants promised to continue keeping the AUA community aware of new and useful technologies and services which should benefit our students and us all.
